Alliance for the Arts: 2022 Spring Break Arts Camp Covid-19 Policy

The Alliance for the Arts will begin hosting a small, socially distant, Spring Break Arts Camp the week of March 21-25.

As an organization whose mission is to transform lives and improve our community through the arts by bringing people together to experience meaningful moments, we remain committed to ensuring the health and safety of our patrons, visitors, volunteers and staff. Our goal is to mitigate the potential risk for transmission of COVID-19 on our campus.

Masks are required at all times inside the building and when social distancing is not possible. Alliance staff, camp instructors and volunteers are required to wear face coverings at all times. All patrons, staff and volunteers are required to adhere to all posted procedural signs.

Additional precautions include:

- The Alliance offers a 50% refund policy if sick or exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms.
- The Alliance will notify parents and guests if they were potentially exposed to COVID-19 during an onsite event.
- The Alliance will continue enforcing cleaning processes of high touch areas, however, outdoor events will have minimum touchpoints.
- Access to hand sanitizing stations at entrances and in high-traffic areas.
- Camp groups are capped at 15 students per class.
- Water fountains remain closed, please be sure to pack extra water bottles in your child's lunch box.

Your child should not attend Spring Break Arts Camp if:

- They have been exhibiting any symptoms of Covid-19 including: fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, new loss of smell or taste, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea.
- They have had close contact with someone who has exhibited COVID-19 symptoms or have been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- They have visited an area where there has been a significant outbreak of COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

In closing, we are closely following updates from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the World Health Organization (WHO), as well as state and local health authorities, to take appropriate measures during this rapidly evolving coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

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Together, we have a shared goal of providing your child with a fun and safe Spring Break Arts Camp experience while taking the necessary steps to keep our community safe and limit person-to-person spread within our communities. We will continue to monitor the situation, adjust our practices as necessary, and provide you with immediate information and updates as required.

By completing this registration, I indicate and confirm that the following statements are true:

- No one in my home is exhibiting any symptoms related to COVID-19, i.e. fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, new loss of taste or smell, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- My child is not exhibiting any symptoms related to COVID-19, i.e. fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, new loss of taste or smell, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- No one in my household has had any close contact with someone who has exhibited COVID-19 symptoms or who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- No one in my household has visited an area where there has been a significant outbreak of COVID-19 activity in the last 14 days.
- I agree that neither myself nor my child has had a fever for at least 24 hours (that is one full day of no fever without the use of medicine that reduces fevers.
- I agree that 10 days have passed since my or my child's COVID-19 test (*if previously diagnosed with COVID-19 without symptoms*)
- I understand that the Alliance reserves the right to ask me to vacate campus grounds for non-compliance with its Covid-19 policies.
- My child and I agree to abide by the Alliance for the Arts' rules on social distancing, handwashing, and face coverings during time on campus.

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
